

## Criteria for the use of International and “Scandinavian Black Type”

Dansk Galop (The Danish Jockey Club) is not responsible for any typing or typographical errors in the catalogue.

The Black Type used within the catalogue is subject to the standards of the ICSC (International Cataloguing Standards Committee). “Scandinavian Black Type” is used within Sweden, Norway and Denmark to highlight performances made in “Classic Races” and other notable races as shown in the list below.

In the catalogue, horses that have won or been placed second or third in approved Group- or Listed races are marked in **bold** (Black Type), while the Black Type race status also is indicated in bold, i.e.: **(Gr2)**.

The Pattern Race system was established in 1971, and horses who before 1971 have won or been placed in the subject races, which later received the status of Group or Listed, are also marked in **bold**, but without indication of status.

In addition, horses that have won or been placed second or third in a series of Scandinavian races are shown in “**semi-bold**”. This applies to the following races:

- All Scandinavian Classic Races (Derby, 1000 Guineas, 2000 Guineas, Oaks and St. Leger)
- Norsk, Svenskt and Dansk Kriterium
- Skandinavisk Opdrætningsløb
- Skandinavisk Mesterskap for 2-åringer
- The Heatherwold Cup
- Lambada Cup (Malmö Stads Pris)
- Amacitalöpning
- Vinterfavoritternes Ærespræmie, Vinterfavoriternas Pris
- Skandinavisk Mesterskap for 3-åringer
- Breeders’ Trophy Juvenile, Breeders’ Prize Classic, Breeders’ Trophy Classic, Breeders’ Trophy Mile, Breeders’ Trophy Stayer, Breeders’ Trophy Sprint, Dansk Breeders’ Cup

The above list of races is NOT officially approved by the European Pattern Race Committee.

## Examples of the typography used in the catalogue:

**FLYING GOLD:** has won a European Group or Listed race, an American or Australian Graded or Stakes race.

**Flying Gold:** has been placed 2nd or 3rd in a European Group or Listed race, an American or Australian Graded or Stakes race.

**FLYING GOLD:** has won a race within the “Scandinavian Black Type” system from the list on the opposite page.

**Flying Gold:** has been placed 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> in a race within the “Scandinavian” Black Type system from the list on the opposite page.

FLYING GOLD: is a winner.

Flying Gold: is not subject to any of the above categories.

***FLYING GOLD.*** has won a European jump race categorized as a Group or Listed Race.

***Flying Gold.*** has been placed 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> in a European jump race categorized as a Group or Listed race.
